As part of the SWANA Young Professionals Group's efforts during WASTECON, various activities for YP's by YP's were offered and the Solid Waste Design Competition, SWDC, conducted on Monday August 22nd was among them.

The competition focuses on solving a real-world problem that professionals may confront in the solid waste management field. This year's SWDC focused on landfill mining, an upcoming topic in the solid waste management field. Students were given a problem statement were various facts and figures of the landfill were provided, with which an evaluation of the current state of the landfill must be completed with the purpose of comparing it with the possibility of mining the landfill. As part of their Project, the students had to complete a cost-benefit analysis and present their findings.

Of the five university teams that showed interest in participating, only three could submit their projects in time: Florida State University, University of Texas – Arlington and the Polytechnic University of Puerto Rico (PUPR). After project evaluation, made on August 23rd 2016, the PUPR team got the second place in the competition.
